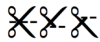

GENERAL ADVANCE HEALTH CARE DIRECTIVES / FUNERAL PLANNING

Advanced directives are for times when you can't speak for yourself. Advance directives are legal documents that allow you to spell out your decisions about end-of-life care ahead of time. They give you a way to tell your wishes to family, friends, and health care professionals and to avoid confusion later on. They can also be used to appoint someone to make decisions for you, if you can't do so yourself. An advance health directive will not affect the type or quality of your care while you can voice your own decisions. It only comes into play when you can't.
