

2017-2018 World's Best Workforce

- All children are ready for school.
- All third-graders can read at grade level.
- All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.
- All students are ready for career and college.
- All students graduate from high school.

SMART GOALS

All children are ready for school.

The percentage of children between their third and fourth birthday screened for school readiness will increase from 80% in 2017 to 85% by September 30, 2018.

All 3rd graders can read at grade level.

Using MCA data from the MN report card 55% of 3rd graders in ISD 690 will meet or exceed standards on the 2018 MCA-III Reading Exam. This will be an increase of 3% from 2017.

All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed.

High School:

Using MCA data from the MN report card 30% of Asian/Pacific Islander and 35% American Indian/Alaskan Native high school students in ISD 690 will meet or exceed standards on the 2018 MCA-III Math Assessment.

This will be an increase of 1.7% for Asian/Pacific Islander students and 8.1% for American Indian/Alaskan Native students from 2017.

Using MCA data from the MN report card 50% of Asian/Pacific Islander and 55% of American Indian/Alaskan Native high school students in ISD 690 will meet or exceed standards on the 2018 MCA-III Reading Assessment.

This will be an increase of 2.7% for Asian/Pacific Islander students and for 2.3% American Indian/Alaskan Native students from 2017.

Elementary:

Using MCA data from the MN report card 45% of Asian/Pacific Islander and American Indian/Alaskan Native elementary students in ISD 690 will meet or exceed standards on the 2018 MCA-III Math Assessment.

This will be an increase of 4.3% for Asian/Pacific Islander students and 5% for American Indian/Alaskan Native students from 2017.

Using MCA data from the MN report card 62% of Asian/Pacific Islander elementary students in ISD 690 will meet or exceed standards on the 2018 MCA-III Reading Assessment.

This will be an increase of 2.8% for Asian/Pacific Islander students from 2017.

All students are ready for career and college.

100% of seniors will participate in the RAMP-UP college and career readiness program and will have taken either the ASVAB or ACT Plus Writing exam prior to graduation in 2018.

All students graduate from high school.

97% of high school students will graduate in 2018.
